Question: Why would I use naloxone on a person who used cocaine?

Answer:

- It can be difficult to know exactly what is in the substances people use.
- Someone may think they're using cocaine, but it can have other substances in it, like opioids such as fentanyl.
- Naloxone doesn't work on a cocaine (stimulant) overdose. However, it
 will work on an overdose caused by opioids that someone may not know
 is in the cocaine they're taking.
- Our partners have heard that naloxone was used to revive people who thought they were using cocaine over the past couple of weeks.
- Naloxone is safe to give, even if the overdose isn't caused by opioids (<u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>, 2023).

When in doubt, give naloxone.
